**Extra Credit Reading for Students in English 10, 11, and 12**  
to be applied to the  
**2011-2012 Academic Year**

Extra Credit: 10 bank points per book (up to but not exceeding 50 points)

In order to earn all 10 bank points, a student must complete the following requirements:

1. Read a book from the designated reading list between May 26 and August 8, 2011.
2. Pass a ten-question multiple choice test over the novel with a score of 70% or above.
3. Sign a form indicating that the novel has been read in its entirety during the summer of 2011.

**Note: Students will not be given extra credit for reading books not found on the attached designated list.**

Students must adhere to the following guidelines when using their acquired bank points:

1. They may not use more than 15 bank points per quarter.
2. Bank points may only be added to test scores (or the equivalent thereof, such as a writing assignment).
3. Bank points may not be used to augment quiz grades or exam grades.
4. No test score may be augmented beyond 100%.
5. Students in *British Literature 12* or *AP Literature and Composition* may not use bank points to augment their literary analysis score.
6. Bank points not used must be forfeited at the end of the year.

This choice is only for an incoming eleventh or twelfth grade student who did not read this novel in Literature 10. Also, this is not a choice for those who will be in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade during the 2011-2012 academic year since this book will likely be required reading for that course.)

***Silas Marner* George Eliot** (Note: This choice is only for incoming eleventh or twelfth grade student who did not read this novel in Literature 10. Also, this is not a choice for those who will be in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade during the 2011-2012 academic year since this book will likely be required reading for that course.)

***The Scarlet Letter* by Nathaniel Hawthorne** (Note: This choice is only for an incoming senior who did not attend KHCS in the eleventh grade and who has not read this book before.)
